Offered by the Conseil des arts de Montréal, the Residency of the Americas at Fonderie Darling fosters an artistic dynamic throughout the American continent and actively contributes to establishing long-term relationships between the various communities of the Americas. Since its creation in 2008, the residency program has hosted 24 artists and curators in visual arts in Montreal, visiting from Brazil, the USA, Argentina, Colombia, Cuba, Puerto Rico, Salvador, Mexico, Peru, Chile, and Canada. Since 2016, the program focuses exclusively on artists and curators from Latin America and the Caribbean, and hopes to support emerging creators specifically. It fully participates in the strategies developed by the City of Montreal to reach out to various communities, and claim cultural values based on inclusiveness and open-mindedness.

The Residency of the Americas is two-fold: artists are hosted for 3 months, followed by curators for 2 months. As the role of curators in the ecology of contemporary art has been increasing in the past decades, Fonderie Darling is proud to claim the relevance of this component of the program, which allows art critics and curators to develop a critical view on contemporary art in Quebec and play a role of mediators between various cultures and artistic scenes. The two complementary aspects of the residency are instrumental to the creation of a diverse community of professionals in the arts, and the collaboration between artists and curators from different backgrounds.

Hosted in the former industrial complex of the Fonderie Darling, residents benefit from a live-in studio of approximately 60m2, equipped with a kitchen corner, access to production facilities outfitted to work with wood, metal, ceramic, and CNC cutting. Various events, public and professional meetings, studio visits and cultural excursions are organized according to the interest of the artist and curator throughout their stay.

The residency includes:

- Roundtrip airfare up to 1,200 CAD

- Artist: live-in studio for 3 months from January 01 to March 31, 2021, a weekly stipend of 400 CAD for 12 weeks, a production budget up to 500 CAD

- <u>Curator/Art Critic</u>: live-in studio for 2 months from **April 01 to May 31, 2021**, a weekly stipend of 400 CAD for 8 weeks, a production budget up to 250 CAD

- Promotion and support program (individual guidance, networking, studio visits, a public discussion of the work, etc.)

Applications will be evaluated by a committee of professionals according to the following criteria:

- The artistic curatorial quality of the candidate's work

- The impact of the residency on the candidate's career
- The proposed residency project
- The clarity of the application and the consistency of the artistic proposal

Candidates in this program must submit a complete package by email to <u>residence@fonderiedarling.org</u> **no later than midnight on Monday, May 04, 2020 (UTC-4, Eastern Time)**. Files must be compressed and submitted via a data transfer platform such as Wetransfer. The application must not exceed 1GB. You will receive an acknowledgement of receipt within 5 business days. Only complete applications will be considered.
