As a site for collective production and exchange since 2007, Place Publique fosters encounters around the visual arts, civic engagement and ecology on a section of Ottawa street. For the 13th edition of Place Publique, the Darling Foundry launches a call for applications to emerging curators based in Montreal to program a series of 5 performance evenings. The initiative will contribute to the professional training of a curator in visual arts by way of a unique platform for public outreach and an immersion in the team of the Darling Foundry, following a series of fruitful collaborations with students from Montreal universities (Concordia in 2017 and UQÀM in 2018).

The theme for Place Publique 2020 is synchronized with the group show presented from June 11 to August 23, 2020: *FEEDBACK, Marshall McLuhan and the arts,* a travelling project composed of exhibitions and public programs initiated in 2017 by German-Canadian curator Baruch Gottlieb (for more info, please visit our website). Curators are invited to propose a performative program in connection with the issues raised by *FEEDBACK* and Marshall McLuhan's thoughts, including our relation to technologies, how technologies transform us and how we in turn can repurpose them, or any other topic whose relevance shall be demonstrated.

MANDATE

- Conceive a program of 5 performance evenings at Place Publique
- Coordinate with the artist and DF team for administration, communication and logistics
- Produce presentation texts for each evening
- Plan and follow a work schedule over 5 months

REMUNERATION AND CONDITIONS

• Involvement of a minimum of 2 days/week at DF from April to August 2020, compensated by a fee of \$1,500

Availability and engagement to all of Place Publique evenings (every Thursday from June 11 to August 20, 2020)
Optional: applicants eligible to the FRQSC program of Scholarship for Internship in a Practice Environment will be favoured in the selection process (in order to increase remuneration and implication at DF)
